

Complete Sweep of Men's Division Honors Accomplished By United States Fencers

ENTERING a full team in Pan American fencing competition for the first time, the United States virtually monopolized the duelling in the 1959 Games.

The squad of 21—18 men and three women—also benefitted from the experiences of the American team which was host for 1958 world championships at Philadelphia.

"The biggest lesson learned there," said Pan American Captain Ralph Goldstein, "was that while we were on a par technically with the Europeans, they surpassed us when it came to physical condition and stamina."

"The physical condition of the team was superb and was an important factor contributing to the impressive results."

Condition, as well as performances in the 1958 and 1959 National championships, determined the selection of the US team.

Talent plus condition resulted in a grand slam of all of the men's

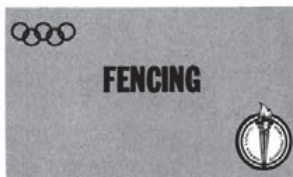
championships—individual and team, in the foil, epee and sabre. The men also captured the silver and bronze medals in epee and sabre.

The women's foil title, however, was won by Mexico's Maria Del Pilar Roldan. The senorita dethroned Mrs. Maxine Mitchell, a 42-year-old housewife from Los Angeles. The Mexican star defeated Mrs. Mitchell, 4-2, in the final match for the title. Each had a 5-1 record going into the decisive bout. Mrs. Mitchell and Stella Espino de Sauer of Panama each had 5-2 records but the American won the silver medal on fewest touches (15 to 18) against her. Vivienne Sokol of New York was fourth with 4-3. Harriet King of New York (2-6) was eliminated in the preliminary pool.

While Mrs. Mitchell lost her title, Harold Goldsmith of New York retained his with a 7-1 record and led the US to the team foil title. Albert Axelrod (6-2) of New York was second and Joseph Paletta (5-3) of New Rochelle, N. Y., was third.

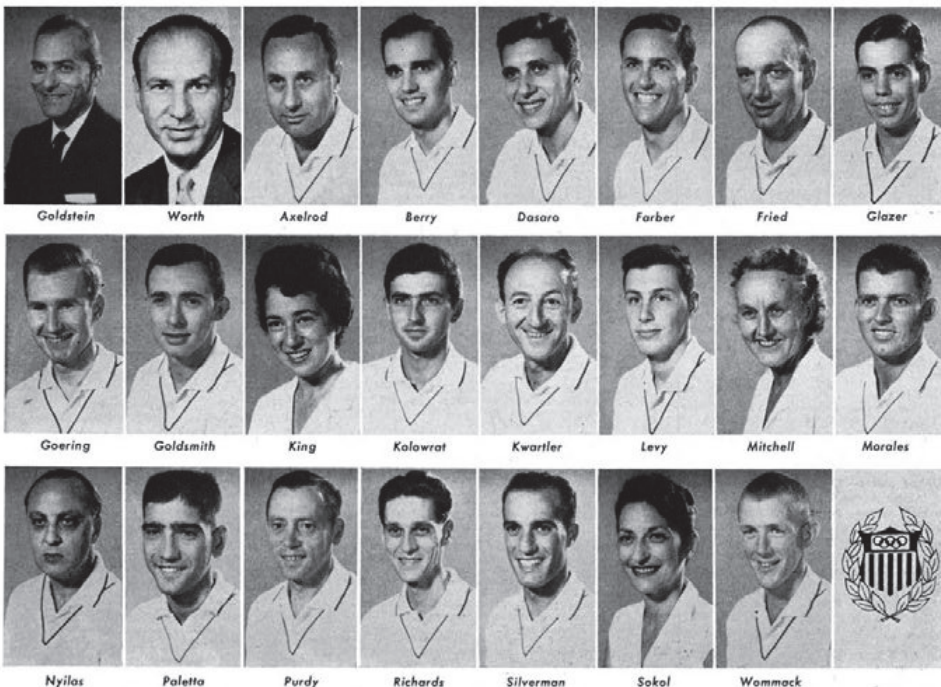
In the final team round robin, the

US closed with a 3-0 record. Venezuela (1-2) was second and Canada (1-2) third. Besides Goldsmith, Axelrod and Paletta, the foil gold medalists included Gene Glazer, New York; Edwin Richards, Boston, and Lawrence Silverman, Chicago.



Roland Wommack, the NCAA champion from the Naval Academy, won the epee crown with a 6-1 record. Teammate Mike Dasaro (4-3) of New York was second on least touches and Alberto Balestrini (4-3) of Argentina third. Wommack swept his first six bouts, taking the clinching sixth over Balestrini, 5-1, in just 33

PAN AM FENCING TRIALS

Selection of the 18 men and three women in the Pan American fencing team was accomplished by the U. S. Olympic Fencing Committee meeting at the conclusion of the national championships in Los Angeles, Calif., July 4. The tournament started June 27, 1959.

Selection of the fencers was based upon performance in both the 1958 and 1959 nationals, as well as the 1958 world meet.

The team included eight who have represented the USA in Olympic competition. They include Albert Axelrod (1948-52-56), Abram Cohen (1956), Harold Goldsmith (1952-56), Allan Kwartler (1952-56), Byron Krieger (1952-56), Mrs. Maxine Mitchell (1952-56), Dr. Tibor Nyilas (1948-52-56), and George Worth (1948-52-56). Worth and Nyilas also were on the 1951 and 1955 Pan American teams, Krieger on the 1951 contingent, and all others on the 1955 unit.

Worth twice won silver medals in the Pan American Saber event. Nyilas was 1951 saber champion, placed fifth in 1955. Axelrod was second in the 1955 foils. Mrs. Mitchell won the 1955 women's foils championship, while Goldsmith performed similarly in the 1955 men's foils. Krieger placed sixth in both the foils and saber events in 1951. Cohen was fourth in the 1955 epee and Kwartler was fifth in the 1955 foils.

In 1955 team competition, the USA won the saber title, placed second in both the epee and the foils; the record was better in 1951, the USA winning both foils and saber, placing second in the epee.
