Complete Sweep of Men's Division Honors Accomplished By United States Fencers

ENTERING a full team in Pan American fencing competition for the first time, the United States virtually monopolized the duelling in the 1959 Games.

The squad of 21—18 men and three women—also benefitted from the experiences of the American team which was host for 1958 world cham-

which was nost for 1938 world cham-pionships at Philadelphia.

"The biggest lesson learned there," said Pan American Captain Ralph Goldstein, "was that while we were on a par technically with the Euro-peans, they surpassed us when it came to physical condition and stam-"The physical condition of the team

was superb and was an important factor contributing to the impressive results. Condition, as well as performances in the 1958 and 1959 National cham-

pionships, determined the selection of the US team.

Talent plus condition resulted in a grand slam of all of the men's


championships—individual and team, in the foil, epee and sabre. The men also captured the silver and bronze medals in epee and sabre.

The women's foil title, however, was won by Mexico's Maria Del Pilar Roldan. The senorita dethroned Mrs. Maxine Mitchell, a 42-year-old housewife from Los Angeles. The Mexican star defeated Mrs. Mitchell, 4-2, in the final match for the title. Each had a 5-1 record going into the decisive bout. Mrs. Mitchell and Stella Espino de Sauer of Panama each had 5-2 records but the American won the silver medal on fewest touches (15 to 18) against her, Vivienne Sokol of New York was fourth with 4-3, Harriet King of New York (2-6) was elim-inated in the preliminary pool, While Mrs. Mitchell lost her title,


Harold Goldsmith of New York re-tained his with a 7-1 record and led the US to the team foil title. Albert Axelrod (6-2) of New York was second and Joseph Paletta (5-3) of New Rochelle, N. Y., was third, In the final team round robin, the

US closed with a 3-0 record. Venezuela (1-2) was second and Canada (1-2) third. Besides Goldsmith, Axel-(1-2) third, Besides Goldsmith, Axei-rod and Paletta, the foil gold medal-ists included Gene Glazer, New York; Edwin Richards, Boston, and Lawrence Silverman, Chicago.
