## CLIMATE, ALTITUDE & POPULATION

Salt Lake City averages a daily maximum temperature for April that's between 58 and 66 degrees Fahrenheit (14 to 19 degrees Celsius).

Salt Lake City, Utah's high-elevation capital (4,327 ft/1,319 m), is bordered by the buoyant waters of the Great Salt Lake and the snow-capped peaks of the Wasatch Range.



## AIRPORT TO DOWNTOWN LIGHT RAIL & GROUND TRANSPORTATION

#### TRAX/Light Rail Service

The most convenient way to access downtown Salt Lake City from Salt Lake City International Airport is via light rail which travels directly to downtown with no transfers needed and is a 30-minute route.

The downtown hotels are within walking distance to the TRAX light rail stops, competition venue, restaurants, attractions and shopping.

One-way fare for the train or bus from/to the airport is \$2.50 USD per person.

Public transportation to and from the Salt Lake City International Airport is managed by the Utah Transit Authority (UTA).

The TRAX/light rail Green Line leaves the airport every 15 minutes on weekdays and every 20 minutes on weekends. The TRAX stop is located at the south end of Terminal 1. Junior World Championship staff will be available at the Salt Lake City International Airport to assist with access to the light rail and

#### **ENTRY FEES**

#### **VISA SUPPORT**

Should your federation need assistance applying for an entry VISA into the United States, please provide the cadre details in the form **HERE** and include all requested information, a copy of the passport and email it to **d.doughton@usafencing.org**.

The deadline for VISA application assistance in March 15, 2020.

#### TRAVEL ADVISORY

Please note that nationals of **Visa Waiver Program (VWP)** countries that are eligible to enter the United States with an ESTA visa must apply for a visa if those personnel have traveled to Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria or Yemen.

These individuals must apply for a B1/B2 tourist visa at the nearest United States Embassy or consulate.

VENUE & COMPETITION

#### **HOW TO APPLY FOR A VISA**

Information on how to apply for a B1/B2 tourist visa may be found online at: https://ceac.state.gov/genniv/.

There are several steps to apply for a visa. The order of these steps and how you complete them may vary at the U.S. Embassy or Consulate where you apply. Please consult the instructions available on the **U.S. Embassy or Consulate website** where you will apply.

Two main stages of the process are listed below for your reference:

#### **COMPLETE THE ONLINE VISA APPLICATION**

- Online Non-immigrant Visa Application, Form DS-160 Learn more about completing the DS-160. You must: 1) complete the online visa application and 2) print the application form confirmation page to bring to your interview.
- Photo You will upload your photo while completing the online Form DS-160. Your photo must be in the format explained in the **Photograph Requirements**.

#### **SCHEDULE AN INTERVIEW**

- You must schedule an appointment for your visa interview, generally, at the U.S. Embassy or Consulate in the country where you live. You may schedule your interview at any U.S. Embassy or Consulate, but be aware that it may be difficult to qualify for a visa outside of your place of permanent residence.
- Wait times for interview appointments vary by location, season, and visa category, so you should apply for your visa as soon as possible.

#### MINOR ATHLETE TRAVEL

Athletes under age 18 (minors) must be accompanied by one parent or legal guardian or they must have an underage form notarized which form will be checked at the accreditation desk. No unaccompanied minor without a notarized form will be allowed to the competition. There is a risk that unaccompanied minors will be blocked at the borders if they don't have the proper documentation. View FIE Minor Athlete Travel Form.

## **CONTROL CHECKING CENTER**

#### **OPENS MARCH 31**

The number of articles submitted to Control is limited to a maximum of:

- 4 weapons (foil and epee with FIE homologated blades)
- 3 body wires
- 3 mask wires (foil and sabre only)
- 2 conductive jackets with names and country codes (foil and sabre)
- 2 FIE homologated masks
- 2 FIE homologated uniforms (jackets, breeches, plastron)
- 1 FIE homologated chest protector (mandatory for women foilists; optional for men foilists)
- 2 gloves (FIE homologated for sabre only)
- Each fencer should submit all of his/her items to the Control in a fencing bag

There should be no extra or personal items in the fencing bag when it is submitted to the Control.
