

FFSA Junior National Championships 2017

DATE: Saturday, 4th and Sunday, 5th February 2017

VENUE: Soweto Communal Hall, Orlando East

STATUS: This is a selection cut-off event for the Junior World

Championships to be held in Plovdiv, in Bulgaria from the

1 to 10th April 2017

ENTRY: ENTRIES CLOSE ON 23rd JANUARY 2017

Please notify your Club Administrator of your desire to enter so that they can enter your request on the Ophardt system for entry into the Junior National Championship. You should receive a confirmation notice of your entry via email from the Club Administrator. For queries contact your Club Administrator.* List of Administrators below.

NB: No U11, U13 & U15 events cannot be entered on Ophardt. Entries for these events must be sent directly to Jo Ann Saner at fencing@li.co.za.

The entry must include the Fencer Name, Club, Province & date of birth (dd/mm/yy) of the fencer.

Please obtain and pay for your 2017 **FFSA Licence** from your Provincial Fencing Association.

The Annual National Licence is R350 for the Year 2017, and is due payable in January of each year. As per a FFSA Council Decision no once-off licences will be issued in 2017.

Please send proof of license payment to your provincial administrator.



Pay Junior National Entry Fee:

R 350 for the first two events (be it weapon or age group) plus an additional R50 per additional event thereafter.

i.e. Entered 2 events = R 350, Entered 3 events = R400, Entered 4 events = R450, ...

"Development Fencers": fencers who have been declared by Province and approved by FFSA.

R50 payable by fencer to GFA for first two events plus an additional R50 per additional event thereafter.

i.e. Entered 2 events = R 50, Entered 3 events = R100, Entered 4 events = R150, ...

Only EFT payments will be accepted. No cash will be accepted at the venue.

Payments to be made by close of business on the Monday, **23rd January 2017**.

Late entry after the prescribed cut-off date will result in paying a fee of double the competition entry fee. As circumstances vary, the acceptance of late entries will be at the discretion of the organiser, which will not be unreasonably withheld. Payment cut-off date and method are at the discretion of the competition organisers.



COMPETITION RULES:

A Fencer will only be permitted to enter his/her own age group, and ONE
up. If there is no competition in the fencer's age group, the fencer will be allowed
to fence in the immediate next higher age group event being held as well as one
age group up, provided the fencer meets the prescribed minimum age prescribed
below for the event(s) involved.

Fencing Age guidelines for 2017:

- Lower age limits:
 - Only For Junior Nationals:
 - For a fencer to compete in the U11, U13 or U15 events, a fencer must be 8 years old at 24:00 on the 31st Decembe2016.
 - For a fencer to compete in the U17 and U20 events, a fencer must be 12 years old at 24:00 on the 31st
 December 2016.
- Upper age limits:
 - The upper age limit is divided into three groups:
 - At Junior Nationals for U15 and younger:
 - The age of the Fencer at 24:00 on the 31st
 December 2016.
 - U11 must be 10 years or younger
 - U13 must be 12 years or younger
 - U15 must be 14 years or younger
- 2. Fencers are to sign the provided Indemnity Form with registration, at the registration desk.
- An event will take place if there are 4 and more fencers per age group.
 If there are only 4 entries in an event only a final DE will be fenced for Gold and Silver medals.



- 4. For events with five or more competitors, a gold medal, a silver and one bronze medals will be awarded. A competition with only five entries will fence off for third place.
- 5. If there are insufficient entries to hold separate gender events, a mixed event will be held. One set of medals will be awarded if there is a mixed event.
- 6. No foil mask bibs for U11 and U13 will be necessary.
- 7. Size 3 blades are recommended for U11 and U13 fencers.
- 8. Foreign Fencers are not allowed to fence in the Junior National Competitions.
- 9. Fencers who have permanent residency are allowed to fence in all competitions.
- 10. The competition may not be delayed by waiting for fencers fencers must sign the attendance register before the competition, and if a fencer is not present at roll-call they will be excluded.
- 11. Weapons are to be checked before the event, and during pool and DE bouts.
- 12. A certified 350N Plastron is to be worn by a fencer at any national event
- 13. No tracksuit pants may be worn. Breeches and long socks only.
- 14. All fencers on the piste must have access to at least one spare working weapon, body wire and mask clip at the side of the piste.
- 15. Electric jackets and mask bibs may be tested for resistance.



- 16. Fencers must be aware of doping regulations. Any fencer may be tested.
- 17. Weapon repairs done at the Competition are at a cost and payable to the person/s doing the repair.
- 18. Medals will be presented shortly after the end of an event, but bearing in mind that other bouts are to continue and may not be interrupted unless agreed to by the Referees.
- 19. All Fencers receiving medals are required to be dressed accordingly in Fencing attire (Jacket zipped closed) or their Club / Provincial / National official track suit. No t-shirts or branded attire is permitted.
- 20. Spectators, Fencers & Coaches are reminded to refresh their understanding of rules t82, t83 & t92 & t93 with regard to behavior.
- 21. Provinces must confirm the names of their **accompanying Referees** to Mike Stafford and the organizers via email, by the 25.1. 2017 (closing date). Referees sent by their province may not refuse if called upon to referee.
- 22. Provinces are required to supply necessary scoring equipment to the competition as requested.
- 23. Current National Rankings can be found on http://www.fencingworldwide.com/en/
- 24. The Organising Committee reserves the right to change the order of the programme. Finishing times can only be estimated once all entries have been received. Such times are dependent on the number of entries, availability of Referees and the promptness of Fencers to present themselves on the Piste.



- 25. Fencers must present themselves at the piste 10 minutes before the announced starting time of an event. Any fencer not present at the piste and ready to fence (may not still be fencing in another event at that time), will be scratched from the event.
- 26. Fencers are therefore cautioned against entering events that are likely to partially overlap. This particularly applies to fencers entering more than one weapon in more than one age group.
- 27. The progress of the schedule depends on the availability of referees and pistes.

PEACE
